

ADMISSION OF STUDENTS
FROM NONCHARTERED OR HOME SCHOOLING

Students seeking admission into the District's schools who have been enrolled in nonchartered schools or home schooling programs may be required to take competency examinations. The purpose of these examinations is to determine the proper grade placement for these students.

In making a placement decision, the Superintendent shall consider:

1. the student's most recent annual academic assessment report;
2. whether to require the student to take any or all of the nationally normed, standardized achievement tests that are regularly scheduled for District students of similar age; and
3. other evaluation information that may include interviews with the student and the parent.

Students entering grades 6-8 are required to take final exams for grade level placement. Students entering grades 9-12 are required to take final exams for credit only.

Home schooled students must be enrolled in the District on a full-time basis in order to participate in cocurricular and extracurricular activities.

Home schooled students must be enrolled in the District on a full-time basis and have approved grades for all required and elective courses in order to be selected as salutatorian or valedictorian for graduation purposes.
