The Senior of the Month Program is sponsored by our Academic Alliance. Each Month a senior is selected by the staff to become our Senior of the Month.

The senior should demonstrate scholarship (including improvement/outstanding efforts), leadership, citizenship, and involvement in school/community activities.

- 3. Mr. Beck and his students completed 9/11 activities in his history classes that he typically does in order to help students learn about and appreciate the significance of that day. He said this year's students really seemed to take the activities seriously and gain a better knowledge of the sacrifices made by first responders as well as the passengers on flight 93.
- 4. 2021-2022 Yearbooks have arrived. Over 90 books were sold, and they are being delivered to the families this week.
- 5. The elementary school counseling program is continuing group counseling services this year, and so far, the response has been positive. After conducting an initial needs assessment via parents/guardians, the categories that are in the most demand for this school year are friendship, anger management, self-esteem, anxiety, and changing families. So far, 51 students have signed up for one or more groups, and more are anticipated in the coming days.
 - *This is a celebration because Mrs. Kelly developed the group counseling program, and she is doing a great job of identifying areas of need and providing services to our students based on their needs. The number of students signed up for these services indicates that Mrs. Kelley is providing opportunities that beneficial, and also that students are developing positive relationships with Kara that will continue to aide in their growth and development.
- 6. Several elementary teachers reported that the first week was very successful. Students were excited to be back, things went smoothly, and teachers are looking forward to having a positive and productive year with their students.
